

# Watercolor textures

## Stone

The stones in stone walls can be very varied in color, size and shape and therefore they make a great subject to paint. Have a go at this exercise to practice painting stone walls.

Lay down a pale variegated wash of cerulean blue and yellow ochre. Allow it to dry.



Use a candle to rub on some wax resist.



Use a small brush and a dark color (anything you like), to paint in some stone shapes. Make them varied and interesting. Then start filling them in with a variety of colors.



Use a flat brush to add some darker shadows to the bottoms of some of the stones.



Finally use a smaller brush to add details.

Spatter on some paint as well with a toothbrush or a larger brush to create random spots.
